CHICAGO BEARS BEAT PACKERS, 14-6

GAME RECAP (GREEN BAY PRESS-GAZETTE)

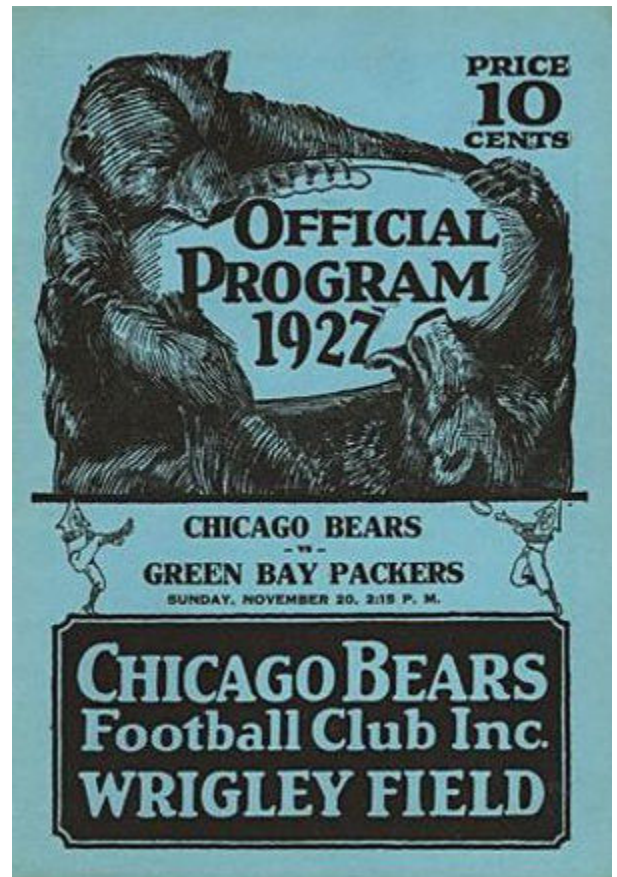
(CHICAGO) - Before the largest crowd of the season at Wrigley field in Chicago yesterday, the Packers went down to defeat at the hands of the Chicago Bears by a score of 14 to 6. But even in defeat the Big Bay Blues played a great game and Green Bay can still be proud of its fighting team. It was a thrilling game, and, according to the fans and sportwriters, the best exhibition of the professional game ever played in the Windy City. Thrill upon thrill was packed into every minute of the game and even the final whistle found the thousands of fans pop-eyed in amazement. It was a tough game for the Packers to lose as a win would have given them undisputed possession of second place. The New York Giants, by virtue of their win over the Cards, continue in first place a half game ahead of the Bears while the Packers are in third position a full game behind the Bears. Standings are apt to be changing considerable as the result of some of the game which will be played on Thanksgiving Day. But getting back to the game itself, and the way it was played. Every man on the Green Bay team can well be proud of his showing. After a discouraging start they came back after the Bears had gotten their touchdown and played the Bruins completely off their feet and had it not been for some tough breaks in the second half would have come through with a win. Lewellen did some of this magnificent punting during the first and second quarters which helped the Green Bay team immensely when they had their backs to the wall. In fact, during practically all of the opening half, the Blues were very much up against it and were always back almost to the goal line. It seemed as if every punt which Driscoll tried took some sort of a freakish hop over the safety's head or out of bounds and nearly every punt which Lew tried was from behind his own goal line. But then when the Packers did get started how did they go. And, believe us, they had the Bears in a quandary to stop their passing.

GREAT PASSING

Dunn and Lambeau did some great forward passing and running and Lewellen and Enright made some wonderful plunges for good gains. Eddie Kotal also did some fine work at his position. The Packer linemen all played magnificent ball and during most of the game outplayed the husky Bear forwards. But for some reason or other they all had a tough time trying to stop the elusive Bill Senn and it was the work of the flashy Bear halfback which brought victory to his team. But in the second half Green Bay had on the field the hardest fighting team which ever wore its Blue and Gold and when the game was over the Green Bay fans, some 500 or more led by the famous Lumberjack band, gave their favorites an enthusiastic cheer. And the Chicago fans also gave the Blues a big hand when they came off the field.

SENN RUNS 52 YARDS

In a game such as this one there is so much to write about that it is hard to know just what to write. During the first and second period the Packers were never in much of a position to try any offensive work but neither was the Bears and it was a punters' dual until shortly after the start of the second quarter. Then Lewellen got off a fine punt and Joe Sternaman grabbed it and ran it back about 25 yards where Lew finally tackled him on the Bear 49 yard line. Then the Bears tried a spread play and Driscoll made a lateral pass to Senn and he grabbed the ball, dodged O'Donnell, was missed by Kotal and by that time had several Bears for interference and with them for a bodyguard ran across the goal. It was a 52-yard sprint and caused some wild rooting in the Chicago section. Sternaman added the extra point with a dropkick. The Packers received the next kickoff but could make little gain and then Lewellen had to kick. The kick was blocked and even though recovered by Rosatti was given back to the Bears on the Packer 35 yard line. A couple of short gains and a penalty gave the Bears a first down on the 25-yard line. Senn made a nice cutback for 10 yards and Sternaman aided by some great interference carried the ball to about one half yard from the Packer goal before being forced out of bounds. White failed to make an inch at center and



the Bears a costly fumble and Sternaman was downed by Dilweg back of the 10-yard line. Senn tried an end run but Kotal tackled him for a loss of one yard and Green Bay got the ball on their own 29-yard line after Driscoll tried a dropkick which was wide of the goal. The Packers took a new lease on life after this and outplayed the Bears during the rest of the half but never could get near enough for a score. In the second half the Packers came back with a new determination and looked like a new team. Driscoll kicked off over the Packer goal and after the ball was put in play on the 20-yard line, the Packers could not gain and Lewellen got back to punt. Standing on his own 10 yard line, he got off a beautiful kick. The ball traveled about 80 yards sailing over Sternaman's head and after he picked it up he ran about 3 yards before Dilweg stopped him on the Bear 13 yard line. The Bears could not gain and punted. Then the Packers opened up. A pass to Lewellen was completed and Enright made a plunge for a couple of yards. Another pass, which Lambeau grabbed, brought the ball nearer the Chicago goal and several line plunges in which Lewellen did some fine work brought the ball to about 3 yards from the goal. On a shift play Lewellen lost about 10 yards and things did not look so bright.

ENRIGHT SCORES

On the next play, Dunn tried a pass and although he was rushed he dodged several oncoming Bears and tosses a long one to Enright in the far corner of the end zone for the Packers touchdown. Dunn failed to make the extra point, his kick being wide. Then the Bears received the kickoff and Fleckenstein fumbled after a few yards return, and Cahoon fell on the ball on the Bear 35-yard line. And another Packer march to the goal was started. A pass to Dunn and another one to Lewellen brought the ball to the Bear 3 yard line. It looked like another Packer touchdown, several thrusts at the line ended with Lewellen making a great plunge. It looked as if he was over the line and Green Bay fans went wild. However, after the referee had unscrambled the pile and set the ball down, it was resting only an inch or so from the goal line and Driscoll punted out of danger. And again the Packers started back toward the goal. During this march, Enright made some great line plunges and the ball was resting on the 7 yard line of the Bears. Dunn tried a field goal but the kick was blocked. After this it was pretty much of a give and take affair with play in the Packers favor. Several time they got deep into Bear territory but could not make the necessary touchdown. The Bears made their last score in the final quarter when Driscoll threw a long pass to Senn, who ran about 5 yards over the goal line. Driscoll made the extra point. With only a few minutes left of the game, Lambeau and his crew threw many passes and brought the ball down the field but time was too short to permit any more scoring as the Bears were playing an airtight forward pass defense and it was mighty hard for the Blues to make any long tosses.

MANY GREEN BAY FANS THERE

Some 500 or more Green Bay fans were in attendance and made themselves very evident by their lusty cheering and they stuck loyally to the team and all one could hear around the hotel and on the trains coming home was the great playing of the Green Bay team even in defeat. And the Lumberjack band did its share to make the Green Bay spirit known. The band marched around the field in their Lumberjack outfits and wearing flaming red socks. These socks were donated by Fred Burrall, through the courtesy of the King Radio company. And in Chicago today Green Bay is just as much on the football map as ever and Chicago fans are asking for another Bear and Packer game. According to rumors making the rounds in Chicago, it would not be at all surprising to see the two teams play again and if they do the same Green Bay fans will be down there in all their glory for they certainly saw a great game.

PLAY BY PLAY

First Period

Jones kicked off to Driscoll who carried the ball back ten yards to the 15-yard line, but Green Bay was off-side and they have to kick over again. They kicked off from the 35-yard line, Jones kicking the ball to Walquist who carried it back to his 41-yard line. Driscoll made 4 yards off left tackle. Walquist was held for no gain at left guard. Driscoll made 2 yards around left end. Driscoll pointed 35 yards. The ball was downed on Green Bay's 43-yard line by Trafton. Lewellen made a beautiful punt of 68 yards from behind his own goal line and Stermann was downed by Dilweg on Green Bay's 41-yard line. Walquist lost a yard at right end, being tackled by Lambson. Driscoll attempted a pass to Knop. Knop slipped and fell, the ball hitting him in the face. On a trick formation Stermann was tackled for a 7-yard loss. It was evidently meant for a forward pass. Driscoll pointed 45 yards over goal line. Green Bay's ball on their own 28-yard line. Lewellen pointed to Stermann who was forced out of bounds by O'Donnell on Bears 27-yard line. Knop made 2 yards at center, tackled by Lambson. Driscoll pointed to Purdy who returned 5 yards, being forced out of bounds on his own 23-yard line. Lewellen is back in punt formation. He fumbled the ball and had to run being downed for 4-yard loss. Stermann fumbled but recovered on his own 43-yard line. Knop made 3 yards over left guard. Knop made 13 1/2 yards at right guard. Bears fumbled and Knop recovered on Packers 43-yard line. Driscoll pointed. The ball took a bounce and rolled out of bounds on the Packers 43-yard line. Lewellen kicked 58 yards to Stermann who was downed by O'Donnell and Dilweg on Packers 22-yard line. Driscoll made 3 yards at left end, being tackled by Dilweg. Knop went over center for 2 yards. Knop picked up about a yard over Packers' left guard. Driscoll attempted a drop kick. The ball was about 2 yards wide of the goal post. Lewellen lost 3 yards on a wide end run around Bears right end. The tackle was made by Trafton. Lewellen pointed to Stermann who was downed by Kotal and O'Donnell on Bears 41-yard line. Walquist passed to Voss for 18 yards, giving the Bears first down on Packers' 18-yard line. Another pass was intercepted by Myers who ran it back 3 yards to his own 21-yard line. Lewellen pointed a long low kick to Stermann who returned 12 yards to his own 41-yard line where Dilweg and O'Donnell tackled him. Driscoll was tackled by Cahoon for a loss of 2 yards. Driscoll tried a kick from a short punt formation and ball was downed by Evans on Green Bay's 19-yard line. On the play Purdy was caught squaring. Purdy carried the ball out of bounds, but the Bears were offside and were penalized 2 yards. The ball is about 4 feet wide of the side line. It's kicking down 2 to go. Kotal tried to carry the ball out of bounds, but Trafton tackled him before he could get outside for no gain as the quarter ended.

Second Quarter

Senn went in for Walquist and White for Knop and Hatas for Hannu. On the next play Kotal carried the ball out of bounds and the Packers ball on their own 23-yard line. Lewellen pointed 48 yards to Stermann who carried the ball back 25 yards where Lewellen tackled him on Bears 43-yard line. Driscoll passed to Senn, a lateral pass, and Senn slipped several Packer tackles and ran 12 yards for a touchdown. Stermann made the extra point by a snap kick. Score, Bears, 7, Packers, 0.

Driscoll kicked off from near the side line and the ball went over the goal line. It's Packers' ball on their own 18-yard line. Lewellen's punt was blocked. Douatt recovered for Green Bay on his 25-yard line and ran 7 back 18 yards, but the official gave the ball to the Bears on the Green Bay 25-yard line. Senn made 2 yards at right guard. White made 2 yards at left guard. Driscoll made 2 yards at left end. Meyer was hurt on the play and took time out. White made a yard at center, but Green Bay was offside and was penalized 2 yards. It is now first down for Bears on 25-yard line. Driscoll made 2 yards at right guard. Senn cut back over right tackle for a gain of 8 yards. It's first down on 15-yard line for Bears. Senn made a yard at center. Stermann went around the Packers left end with some great interference, carrying the ball to one foot line. White failed to gain at center. On the next play Bears fumbled and Stermann was downed by Dilweg on Green Bay's 18-yard line. It's third down 16 yards to go. Senn attempted a wide end run, but Kotal downed him for a yard loss. Driscoll's drop kick was wide of the posts by about a yard. It's Green Bay's ball on their own 26-yard line. Lewellen pointed out of bounds on the Bears 33-yard line. Senn tries an end run, but slipped and Dilweg tackled him for a loss of 2 yards. On a cross-pass play White made 2 yards at center. Driscoll pointed out of bounds on Packers' 45-yard line. Kotal lost 2 yards on a right end run. Lewellen passed to Kotal who ran out of bounds after catching the ball, putting the Packers 12 yards and a first down on Bears' 45-yard line. Lambson plunged through right guard for 2 yards. Kotal made a beautiful plunge over left tackle for eight yards. He made several pivots and twists to make this gain possible. First down on Bears 33-yard line. Lambson tried a plunge, but picked up no steam. Lambson tried a pass to Kotal, but it was incomplete. Kotal tried a pass to Dilweg, which he just missed after a great leap in the air. The Packers were penalized 5 yards for second incomplete pass. Lambson made an underhanded loss to Dilweg, but the play made no ground and Bears took the ball on the 31-yard line. White made 2 yards at center. Driscoll made 3 yards at left end. Driscoll made it first down by inches. It's Bears' ball, first down on their own 41-yard line. Senn ran around right end for 5 yards, being tackled by Kotal. Senn tried a run around left end and Lambson threw him for a

yard loss. Driscoll fumbled but recovered and ran around Packers' right end for 20 yards, eluding several Green Bay tacklers and finally going out of bounds on Green Bay's 18-yard line for a first down. Senn was thrown for a yard loss by Meyer. White pointed on 23 yards at center. Driscoll pointed and Voss downed it on the Packers' 25-yard line, but the Bears were off-side and the ball was re-called, and Green Bay chose the penalty. Bears were set back 5 yards, making it third down, 12 to go on Bears' 12-yard line. Driscoll again pointed to Purdy who was downed in his tracks on Green Bay's 13-yard line by Voss. Kotal carried the ball out of bounds for no gain on a spread formation. Lewellen just missed a pass from Lambson, as the half ended. Lewellen dropped the pass after having the ball in his hands, but it didn't make much difference as he would have been tackled in his tracks. Score, Bears, 7, Packers, 0.

Third Quarter

As the Bears took the field, Hannu was at end in place of Hatas. Walquist went in for Senn and Pleckenstein for Buckler. For Green Bay Red Dunn went in for Purdy. Enright replaced Lambson and Lambson took Kotal's place. Driscoll kicked off to Lambson who let the ball roll by him to the goal line. Packers' ball on their own 28-yard line. Lewellen pointed over Stermann's head and he was downed by Dilweg on the Bears 13-yard line. Walquist was tackled by O'Donnell for no gain. Walquist made about a yard at left tackle. Driscoll pointed to his own 45-yard line. Lambson passed to Lewellen who carried the ball 5 yards to the Bears 27-yard line. Lewellen ran 3 out of bounds. Second down, Enright plunged through Bears' right tackle for 2 yards, but Green Bay was offside and was penalized 2 yards. Ball on Bears 27-yard line. Lewellen tried a pass to Dilweg who dropped it. Dunn passed to Lambson who made a beautiful catch and ran out of bounds on the Bears 13-yard line. Fourth down and about a foot to go. Lewellen plunged over the Bears' left tackle for four yards, putting the ball on Bears' 9-yard line. Lewellen made 1 yard over right guard. Packers' on Bears 4-yard line. Jones kicked off short to McMillen who fumbled and Cahoon recovered for Green Bay on Bears 21-yard line. Lambson passed to Dilweg, but it was incomplete. It just grazed his fingers. The Packers are now showing fight. Dunn made 7 yards around right end, ball being 4 yards from side line. Lewellen was stopped by Pleckenstein for no gain. Lewellen passed to Dunn for a gain of 4 yards and a first down on the Bears 27-yard line. Enright made 3 yards at right guard. Lambson threw a pass to Lewellen, putting the ball on Bears' 43-yard line about 3 yards from side lines. Senn goes in for Walquist, Hatas for Hannu. First down 4 to go. Lewellen made half a yard at center. Dunn was spilt by Pleckenstein for no gain. Lewellen made 2 yards over right guard. Ball on Bears one yard line, fourth down. Lewellen plunged over the Bears right guard for about two feet, and 11 inches. The ball is on the one inch line. The Green Bay team claimed the ball was over. Time out for Bears. Driscoll pointed from behind his own goal line and the ball was downed by Hatas on Bears' 43-yard line. Green Bay's ball there. Enright made 2 yards at center. Senn made 20 yards around Packers' left end. Ball now on Bears 43-yard line. White made 2 yards at center. White took the ball through center for 2 yards. Senn plunged through center for 7 yards and a first down on Packers' 47-yard line. Senn completed a pass to Senn who ran to the Packers' 18-yard line. Senn is going like a house after and Packers are having a tough time tackling him. White carried the ball out of bounds for a gain of 1 yard. Driscoll failed to gain at left guard and Bears are penalized 15 yards for holding. Ball now on Packers' 21-yard line. Driscoll attempted a forward pass which Dunn knocked down. Dunn almost got it, but it just missed his fingers. Driscoll passed to Senn who ran about 5 yards after catching the ball and made a touchdown. Driscoll made the extra point by drop kick. Score, Bears 14, Packers, 6.

Purdy went in for Jones. Driscoll kicked off, the ball going over the goal line. Packers' ball on their own 28-yard line. A forward pass by Dunn to Lambson is carried by Lambson about 15 yards to Packers' 43-yard line. Voss goes in for Trafton. Lewellen tried a pass to O'Donnell, which was incomplete. Lambson tried a pass to Dunn which was incomplete. Packer are penalized 2 yards for second incomplete pass. Lewellen made a sensational pass to Red Dunn who carried it 25 yards to Bears' 18-yard line for a first down. Bears are taking time, with one minute left to play. Driscoll failed to gain on a run around left end. Both sides were offside on the next play. Driscoll made a ground right end as the game ended. Score: Bears, 14, Packers, 6.
