BAUGH, REDSKINS PASTE PACKERS BY 14-6 SCORE

GAME RECAP (GREEN BAY PRESS-GAZETTE)

(WASHINGTON) - That sinister character of the gridiron known as Slingin' Sam Baugh bobbed up once more to confront the Green Bay Packers on Sunday at Griffith stadium and when the business of the afternoon was at an end the Packers found themselves the party to the second part of a 14-6 score. Baugh, the hard galloping, pass throwing back from T.C.U, and his new mates, the Washington Redskins, were on the business end of the tally. Slingin' Sam didn't start the fray, but when he entered rapidly changed the complexion of the entire matinee with his lightning like rushes and aerial bombs. Playing on a surprisingly dry field that had been covered during the all-night rain, the Packers rushed to a score before the end of the first quarter. In the second the elevens bruised each other around the lot with Baugh a constant threat. In the third stanza, however, Sammy whetted his arm and with a pass and run good for 53 yards, from the line of scrimmage set up the initial Capital City score. The Packers came back determined to make a battle of it but about midway in the final period Washington intercepted a Packer pass, and before the assembled bureaucrats in the some 30,000 present had adjusted themselves, Sammy had carved out another score for the Redskins by the grace of his good right arm. The Packers missed a place kick from the 30 early in the first quarter and had been engaged in a punting duel with the New Deal representatives when they finally set out for 61 yards and a score halfway through the first quarter. PASSES TO LAWS

Riley Smith, Washington quarterback, punted out on the Packer 39 and the Green and Gold clad players went to work. Two line plays didn't get anywhere but then little Bobby Monnett faded back and shot a pretty forward to Joe Laws, who was given excellent blocking and encouragement from his teammates as he stepped mincingly along to the Washington 46. Clarke Hinkle made five yards on a steamroller shot through the middle and then Monnett tossed to Don Hutson, who was stopped for another first down on the Washington 33. The Redskins tried a filibuster but the referee broke it up after the usual two minutes and the Bays went back to work. It was third down, seven to go on the Washington 30 when Monnett passed to Laws, who was dumped on the 24, about a yard short of a first down. Schneidman, on a sneak play, wormed over

serious penalty of the game came when Ed Kahn, Redskin lineman, was detected slugging and the referee paced off half the distance to the goal as Mr. Kahn was excused for the balance of the afternoon. Baugh and Vice President John Nance Garner handled the Washington passing, the No. 2 New Dealer throwing the ball in to start the game. Baugh's passes, however, were longer, and straighter. It was announced that the crowd was the largest ever to attend a professional football game in the Capital City.

In winning their eighth game in 10 starts this season, they scored touchdowns in the first and second periods and watched Jack Manders boot a field

the needed yard. Laws and Hinkle drove to the 11. With fourth down and seven to go on the Washington eight, the Packers scored. Hutson cut into the end zone, running one way while Baugh ran another, proving his judgment as wet as a sleepwalker weekending a house boat. The ball floated easily into Hutson's paws and the score was 6 to 0. Ernie Smith's placement attempt was brushed to one side by the furious Redskin forwards. Baugh functioned in the third quarter when with the ball on the Redskin 28 he dropped back, looked deliberately down the field until he spotted Malone, and then launched a gigantic heave that the fleet end caught and carried to the Packer 19. Cliff Battles personally escorted the first Redskin tally over a few moments later and Riley Smith made it 7-6 with a perfect kick. In the last quarter, with the Packers trying desperately to score, the Redskins intercepted a Packer aerial on the Green Bay 34. This time, Malone, feeling slighted perhaps for not having gone the distance on his other effort, took a Baugh toss and then staggered and lunged several steps over the double stripe. Once again Riley Smith finessed the extra point.

GAME HARD FOUGHT

The game was clean, even and hard fought throughout, each side picking up 13 first downs. The Packers made 235 yards from scrimmage on passes and rushing and Washington gleaned 241. The only

goal in the third. Cleveland scored its touchdown in the third period on a forward-lateral, with Ralph (Primo) Miller going over the Bear line. The game was played before a small "homecoming" day crowd of 4,188. Forty former Bears watched the game. It gave Chicago its eighth victory of the year against one defeat and one tie. They meet their inter-city rivals, the Cardinals, in the season finale. Even if the Bears had lost to Cleveland, they still would have won the Western title because of Green Bay's unexpected 14-6 loss to the Redskins.

JANKOWSKI HURT IN GRID DEFEAT

NOV 29 (Washington) - Emergency hospital attaches said today the condition of Ed Jankowski, Green Bay Packers' football fullback, was "just fair". Jankowski received a possible skull fracture in yesterday's prof football game with the Washington Redskins. Taken to the hospital unconscious, the former Wisconsin university star rallied in the early part of the evening. The hospital said he spent a "fairly comfortable night." The hard hitting 205-pound back was a standout on the Packers' defense, although his team lost, 14 to 6. He was hurt when knocked off his feet by two Redskin blockers late in the game.

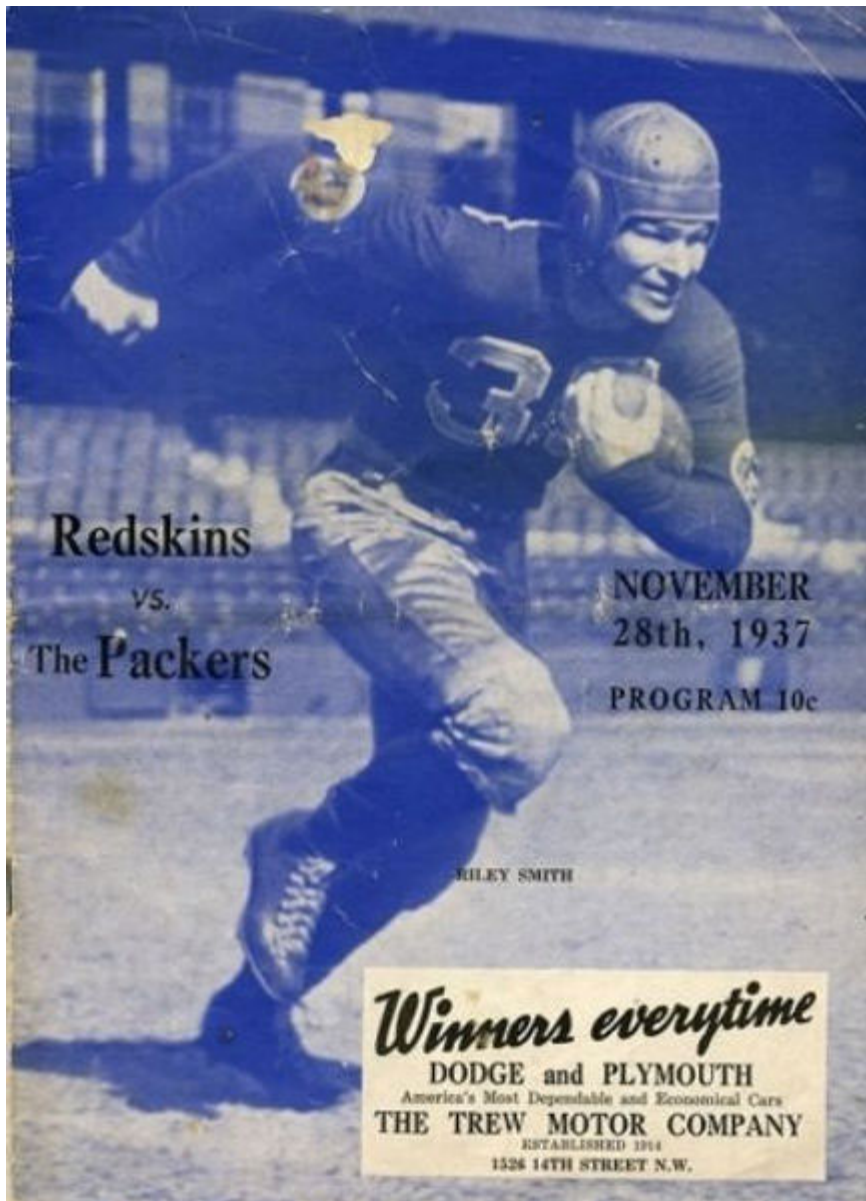

First Period

Hinkle kicked off over the goal line and Washington put the ball in play on its 20. Malone downed Battles' quick kick on his own 49. Hinkle poured through center for ten yards and a first down. Monnett lost five and a pass. Laws to Monnett, was incomplete. Hinkle punted over the goal line from his own 45. It was a beautiful kick and brought a murmur from the crowd. Two plays lost six yards for the Redskins and Battles punted the ball being downed by Millner at midfield.

The Packers failed to gain and Hinkle again booted beautifully, the ball rolling out on the two yard line. Battles, standing behind his own goal line, booted out to Monnett, who took the ball on his own 45, and with a crushing block by Gantenbein, who took out a pair of Redskins, raced to the Washington 25. Two line plays and a pass failed and Hinkle, with Laws holding, attempted a placekick from the 30. The ball, however, squirted to one side and Washington took the ball on its 20. Washington stalled on attack and Riley Smith punted out on the Packers' 39.

Start Scoring March

At this point the Bays started their touchdown march and it was delightful to see. Two line plays gained but one yard and then Monnett faded back and rifled the ball to Laws, who ran to the Washington 46. Once more the Packers blocked to perfection. It was a first down. Hinkle plunged for five to the 41. Monnett tossed to Hutson for another first down on the 33 and Washington took time out.

Slingin' Sam Baugh entered the game for Irwin and was greeted with rars of approval. Ernie Smith replaced Champ Seibold for the Packers. Hinkle picked up three but Monnett was held for no gain. With third down seven yards to go for a first down on the Washington 30, Monnett passed to Laws, who was dumped on the 24. Schneidman plunged for a yard and first down. Laws was driven out of bounds on the 17. Hinkle drove to the 11 and it was again first down. A pass failed and then Hinkle made two. It was third and eight on the Washington nine yard line. Jankowski replaced Hinkle. Monnett passed to Laws, who caught the ball while sitting on the ground but struggled for a one yard gain. Hutson slipped into the end zone and took Monnett's pass for a touchdown. Ernie Smith's try for the extra point was blocked.

On three plays Baugh ran from his 31 to the Packers' 22. The quarter ended a minute later with the ball on the Packers' 21, second down for Washington, nine to go. Score: Packers 6; Washington 0.

Second Period

Riley Smith's placekick was blocked and the ball was given to the Packers on their 12. Herber punted to Riley Smith, who juggled and was tackled on the Redskin 49. Baugh completed a toss to R. Smith back of the line and the play was pushed back to the Redskin 34. It was third down, 21 to go. Baugh launched an enormous punt over the goal line. Miller picked up nine yards but the attack stalled and Herber punted to Baugh who made a short run back to his 24.

It was Battles who plunged twice with the aid of a five yard gain by Baugh and it was first down on the 45. Baugh lofted to R. Smith for 19 yards and a first down on the Packer 37. Baugh ran to the Packer 25 for another first. Baugh's next pass, a long one, was knocked down. Battles circled end for two yards, but Hutson intercepted Baugh's next toss, slipped in a puddle of water on the one yard line, but managed to elude the foe and skipped back to the Packer 24.

Another Long Kick

Herber booted another honey to Baugh who came back seven yards to his own 14. The ball traveled almost the length of the field on carry and bounce. Baugh and Herber again exchanged punts. Battles fumbled Herber's return boot and Jankowski picked it up but was flopped on the Washington 30. Hinkle attempted a placekick from the 40 but it was blocked and Herber recovered as the half ended. Score: Packers 6; Washington 0.

Third Period

Jankowski came back to the 20 with the kickoff. Sauer romped for six around right end. Herber and Hutson functioned for a first down on the Packer 35. Jankowski made four through the line. Herber passed to Hutson for three. Jankowski ran hard for a first down at midfield.

Battles intercepted Herber's pass on his 29 just when it seemed that the Packers were once more on their way. The Redskins made a first down but Jankowski intercepted a Baugh pass on the Washington 39. The Packers lost the ball on downs on Washington's 30 when a Herber to Hutson shot was incomplete on fourth down.

Baugh tossed a short pass to Battles and then shot one to Olson on a trick play that carried to the Packer 33 but the Redskin backfield was guilty of motion on the play and the ball was set back to the Washington 28, where it was second and 12.

Plenty of Time

Slingin' Sam took plenty of time on his next effort and picked out Maloney way down field before he released the ball. The Redskin end took the oval in stride and was almost over for a touchdown but was finally spilled on the Packer 19 as the stands went wild. It was a 53 yard gain on the play.

Battles plunged to the Packer 15. Baugh ran off tackle for three. Battles plunged for almost first down and then plunged to the four yard line where it was first and goal to go. Battles smashed hard for two. He plunged over for a touchdown on the next play. R. Smith kicked goal. Battles holding and the crowd had hysterics. Score: Washington 7; Packers 6.

The Packers came right back, taking the ball on their 20 after Edwards had kicked off over the goal line. Miller plunged for three, Jankowski made another. It was third and five on the Packer 25. Herber passed short to Miller who shot a lateral to Hutson for a first down on the Packer 46. It was a gain of 21 yards. The spark died and Herber punted to Baugh, who made a fair catch on the 17. Baugh quick-kicked back to the Packer 23. The Packers punted again and Baugh scampered about 25 yards with the return before he was dropped on the Packer 48 as the third quarter ended. Score: Washington 7; Packers 6.

Fourth Period

A pass and line plays failed and Baugh punted out on the Packer 11 yard line. Monnett shot a shovel pass to Laws for three yards. Hinkle was knocked out of bounds on the 19 and it was 3rd and 3. Hinkle was again knocked out of bounds but made it first down on the Packer 24. Monnett failed to gain but Hinkle crashed the line for another first.

A Washington back came out of nowhere to intercept a Packer pass on the Packer 34. Baugh passed to Irwin for first down on the 16. Irwin lost two yards. Baugh's pass was incomplete. Baugh passed again, this time to Malone, who caught the ball several stripes from the goal line staggered to regain his balance, and then plunged over a teammate's back and the goal line for another Redskin touchdown. Riley Smith, who had returned to the game, place kicked the extra point. Score: Washington 14, Packers 6.

Washington's kickoff went out of bounds and the Packers went into action on their 35. Herber passed to Hutson for one yard. Herber's toss to Monnett, was incomplete. The Redskins were penalized half the distance to the goal for slugging, putting the ball on Washington's 40 and Ed Kahn Redskin guard, was thumbed from the game as the offender. Herber, back to pass, fumbled on his own 41 and the Redskin recovered. Baugh punted out. Gantenbein snared a Herber aerial for a first down on the Packer 30. Herber passed to Monnett for another 5.

Misses Place Kick

Herber attempted to pass, wheeled, and broke into the clear for 25 yards and a first down on the Washington 44. But six minutes remained. Hinkle tore through center for a first down on the Redskin 32. Monnett lost 10 yards attempting to pass. Monnett passed to Herber and it was last down, 6 to go. Hinkle missed a place kick and Washington took the ball on its 20.

Two line plays failed and Baugh punted to Monnett, who was run out of bounds on his own 30.

Herber's lateral to Monnett was complete but failed to gain. A double fumble in the backfield cost the Packers 7 yards. Hinkle punted to Baugh, who ran back 15 yards to the Packer 45.

Riley Smith made no gain and the Redskins were penalized for backfield in motion. Battles hit center for 2 yards. He plunged again and the Redskins went into executive conference as the game ended. Final score: Washington 14, Packers 6.
